HOA RULES & REGULATIONS

RENTAL PROPERTIES

As a friendly reminder, all homeowners who rent out their homes are responsible for ensuring that their tenants understand and follow the Ironbridge Rules and Regulations.

Please note the following requirements for rental properties:

1. Rental Leases and HOA Compliance

All rental leases are subject to the Declaration of Covenants and the Rules and Regulations of the Ironbridge Association. Any violation of these rules is considered a default under the lease. Homeowners must:

- Provide tenants with a copy of the HOA Rules and Regulations.
- Notify the Association of new tenants by providing their names and contact information.




2. Lease Term Requirements

- All leases must be in writing and for a minimum term of six (6) months.
- Short-term rentals, including VRBO, Airbnb, or similar platforms, are strictly prohibited. (Per Garfield County regulations, short-term rentals are not permitted in a Planned Unit Development (PUD).)

By ensuring your tenants are aware of and comply with Ironbridge's community standards, you help maintain the quality and harmony of our neighborhood. Thank you for doing your part to keep Ironbridge a great place to live!

Winter Parking Reminder: Keep Streets Clear for Snow Removal

As winter approaches and the snow begins to fly, everyone must follow our HOA parking guidelines to ensure streets remain clear and accessible for snow removal vehicles. Your cooperation helps maintain safe driving conditions and efficient snowplowing throughout our community.



Please take note of the following parking rules:

- No Overnight Street Parking (2:00 a.m. – 5:00 a.m.) —
Parking on the streets during these hours is strictly prohibited. Vehicles found in violation may be booted or towed at the owner's expense. There will be no exceptions, so please remind your family members, tenants, and guests of this policy.
- Driveway Parking Limitations — A maximum of three vehicles may be parked in a driveway between 2:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. Any additional vehicles must be parked inside the garage or off-site.
- Prohibited Vehicles — RVs, boats, trailers, motorcycles, or other motorized vehicles may not be parked on the streets at any time. Please refer to the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions for the complete list of prohibited vehicles.

Building Trails Together - November 2025

On a sunny and cool November Saturday, approximately twenty-four Ironbridge residents spread close to 5,000 cubic feet of wood chips over almost a mile-long dirt trail to create a 4-foot-wide, 3" deep soft surface on the existing Heron Crossing River trail and extend that trail out to CR 109.

In addition, on the River Bank Lane pumphouse to the South Ironbridge pumphouse, small rock bridges were added, along with other improvements were made to make this an easier to walk riverside primitive trail. Future enhancements are planned to make this nature trail more

accessible for next summer/fall.

For now, small blue flags mark along with several directional signs mark these nature trails.

Huge thanks to all of you who were able to make this happen. Access to the Roaring Fork River is one of the great benefits of living in Ironbridge.

IRONBRIDGE MARKET UPDATE

December 2025

Recent Sales Activity

Homes have not closed in Ironbridge over the past 30 days, continuing the quiet late-fall pattern typical for our community. However, beneath the surface, there's meaningful activity; three properties are currently under contract.

Current Inventory: Historic Scarcity

Ironbridge inventory has reached an all-time low, with

just **one active listing** remaining: **354 Blue Heron Drive**—the 4-bedroom, 4-bathroom new construction home offering 3,425 square feet at \$1,625,000. This is the final new-construction offering from Sunrise Builders in Ironbridge. Having been on the market for 324 days and reduced from its original \$1,825,000 asking price (a 11% reduction), this premium property includes central A/C, a three-car garage, and high-end finishes throughout.

Pending Sales: Price Discipline Drives Results
Three Ironbridge homes are currently under contract, and they demonstrate clear market dynamics:

- 1 Eagle Claw Circle:** \$875,000 (pending) - Originally \$945,000, this 3-bed/2-bath ranch reduced by 7.4% before finding a buyer after 253 days on market.
- 484 Red Bluff Vista:** \$1,150,000 (pending) - This 3-bed/3-bath two-story adjusted from \$1,200,000 (4.2% reduction) and went under contract in 84 days.
- 643 River Bend Way:** \$1,095,000 (pending) - Reduced from \$1,199,000 (8.7% reduction), this 3-bed/3-bath home achieved pending status in 74 days.

The Pattern: All three pending sales required price adjustments ranging from 4-9%. The homes that saw price reductions of 10% or more found buyers in approximately 2.5 months, while the smaller reductions took over 8 months—clear evidence that current buyers reward realistic pricing.

Ironbridge 2025 Year in Review

Through November 2025, Ironbridge has recorded **15 closed sales** compared to 16 in the same period last year. While transaction volume held relatively steady, pricing dynamics shifted notably:

2025 Performance (Jan-Nov):

- Median Sale Price: **\$1,275,000** (up 24% from \$1,029,000 in 2024)
- Average Sale Price: **\$1,372,910**
- Average Days on Market: **155 days**
- Price Range: \$820,000 - \$2,294,460

Market Shift: While 2025 saw higher median prices, the market has transitioned from the ultra-competitive conditions of 2024. Sellers who priced strategically and remained flexible on terms achieved successful sales, while those who held firm on initial pricing experienced extended market times.


Local Community Comparison

Ironbridge's inventory shortage becomes even more apparent when compared to neighboring (golf) communities:

Key Observations:

- **Ironbridge's** combination of limited supply, accessible pricing (\$1.095M median based on current pending sales), and fast absorption (77 days average for pending sales) positions it uniquely in the local lifestyle community market.
- **Lakota Canyon** offers a lower price point (\$1.01M median) but has 9 active listings with no pending sales
- **Aspen Glen** and **River Valley Ranch** serve the luxury market (\$3.4M-\$4.1M) with substantially longer marketing times (134-209 days)

Ironbridge's combination of limited supply, mid-range pricing (\$1.5M median), and relatively fast absorption (112 DOM) positions it uniquely in the local golf community market.



Glenwood Springs Market Overview

The broader Glenwood Springs single-family market reveals clear segmentation by price:

Market by Segment:

- **Under \$1M:** 14 active homes, 75 days average on market, 50% with price reductions
- **\$1M - \$1.5M:** 7 active homes, 112 days on market, 57% with price reductions
- **\$1.5M - \$2M:** 14 active homes, 134 days on market, 57% with price reductions
- **Over \$2M:** 8 active homes, 132 days on market, 38% with price reductions

November Activity: Only 11 homes sold in Glenwood Springs proper during November, down from 19 in November 2024 (42% decrease). However, homes that did sell averaged \$805,590 and achieved 95% of their asking price—demonstrating that well-priced properties still attract committed buyers.

Price Reductions: Currently, 50% of all active Glenwood Springs listings have reduced their prices at least once, with an average reduction of 8.8%. This is most prevalent in the \$1M-\$2M range, where 57% of listings have adjusted pricing. Notably, 58% of homes currently under contract required price reductions before attracting buyers, averaging 8.9% reductions.

Inventory Aging: Of the 44 active listings in Glenwood Springs:

- 10 are new to market (under 30 days)
- 11 have been listed for 1-3 months
- 23 have been on the market 3+ months

Market Takeaways

1. **Ironbridge's Scarcity:** With only one active listing and three homes under contract, Ironbridge has the tightest inventory of any local golf community. This positions the neighborhood favorably

heading into 2026.

2. **Pricing Discipline Matters:** Every pending sale in Ironbridge required a price adjustment (4-9%). Homes that reduced prices more decisively sold 3x faster than those with minimal adjustments. This pattern holds true across Glenwood Springs, where 58% of pending sales reduced prices first.
3. **Market Segmentation:** The sub-\$1M market moves fastest (75 DOM), while higher-priced segments require 112-134 days. Ironbridge's \$875K-\$1.15M pending sales align with the most active price range.
4. **Comparative Advantage:** Ironbridge maintains pricing power relative to Lakota Canyon (\$1.5M vs \$1.01M median) while offering faster sales velocity than premium communities like Aspen Glen (112 vs 209 DOM).
